



## Alabama community-based summer learning programs achieve academic growth for 13th consecutive year

Alabama communities continue to demonstrate that high-quality summer learning programs can reverse typical summer learning losses. Despite reduced federal funding for summer enrichment, programs utilizing the Alabama-based SAIL (Summer Adventures in Learning) quality framework operated at a record number of sites across the state and delivered measurable academic gains.

## SAIL's Quality Assurance Framework

Research shows that students who do not participate in high-quality summer learning programs typically lose two months or more of learning in both reading and math. SAIL has identified 22 research-based markers of quality that help summer learning programs reverse this trend.



### Overall Program Foundation:

- Combine school and camp elements for whole child development
- Community-based approach pooling shared resources and expertise
- Assessment and continuous improvement system with peer learning
- Stable, predictable funding for multi-year program excellence
- Strategic planning: fall program design, year-end funding, Q1 recruitment
- Academic growth measurement over time



### Academic Programming:

- Nationally normed, formative assessment with pre- and post-testing
- Research-based curriculum aligned to state standards
- Certified teachers, 1:12 staff ratio, rigorous training
- Minimum 72 hours of reading and math instruction



### General Programming:

- 150-180 total programming hours over 5-6 weeks
- Social-emotional learning and character development curriculum
- Physical activity programming, from sports to unstructured play
- Nutritious meals: breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack
- Unifying annual theme connecting all activities
- Affordable programming with transportation support
- Strong enrollment, attendance, and family engagement practices

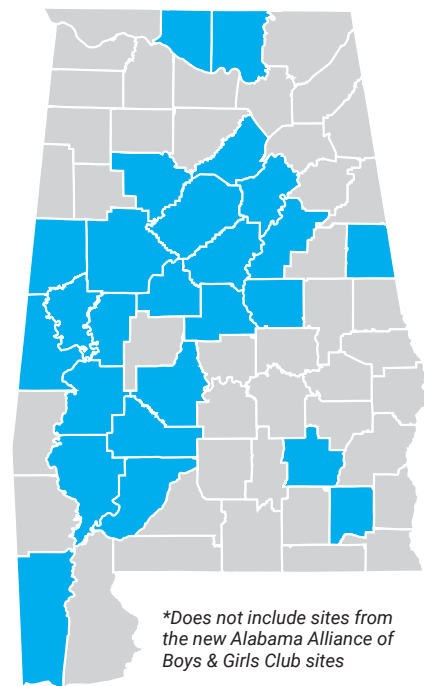


### System & Community Level Support:

- Professional learning network with peer-to-peer education
- Comprehensive student and program performance metrics
- Public sharing of data within the community
- Structured peer review and improvement planning process
- Collaborative problem-solving and backbone organization support

Since its founding in 2012, SAIL has invested over \$11 million in summer learning programs across Alabama that meet these markers, helping more than 24,000 students turn summer learning losses into gains.

In addition to the 73 SAIL-affiliated program sites, this year there were 11 additional Boys and Girls Club-operated sites. This is the first year that all 13 organizations in the Alabama Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs adopted SAIL's quality standards. Four Boys and Girls Club organizations (Central Alabama, West Alabama, North Alabama, and Southeast Alabama) were previously affiliated.
